

Roger Achieves Speedy Success

Roger Thetford, a theoretical physicist at the Harwell Laboratory, has achieved all five of the athletic goals set in conjunction with Running Magazine earlier this year. Roger was selected as one of six amateur runners (out of over 1,000 applicants) to join 'Target '89'.

The Editor of Running Magazine interviewed Roger in February for a feature outlining his athletics background and running goals along with a tough training programme. The feature stated: 'To reach his half-marathon target, Roger Thetford is depending on the same meticulous attention to detail and mental stamina that have served him so well as a scientist'.

Two of the targets were achieved in May: in the British Orienteering Championships, held at Star Posts, near Crowthorne, Roger improved on last year's 74th place to finish 50th; at Leighton Buzzard Roger broke the all-important barrier of 10 miles within one hour, achieving a time of 59 mins 7 secs.

June was also a successful month, with two more barriers smashed during the summer heatwave: Roger's 4 mins 45 secs target for running a mile was achieved at Oxford's Iffley Road track (actual time 4 mins 43 secs); at a 10 km run at Tring, a big effort in the last mile saw Roger home in 34 mins 56 secs, the last of those qualifying inside the 35 mins target time.

The final target of a half marathon in less than 80 mins was achieved in September at Oxford: the time was a magnificent 77 mins 28 secs, when Roger competed as part of a team of four orienteers from the Nag's Head public house in Hythe Bridge Street, Oxford.

Roger, pictured with Miss Phillipa Edwards using the Cray-2 supercomputer, said "Cliff Temple's training plan forced me to go out and run fast sessions. Before I would have run further but at a more steady pace. I had to sharpen up my speed considerably, and the results show that the effort was worthwhile".
