

As part of the recent beam-tuning exercise on Nimrod's extracted proton beams, switching EXTERNAL PROTON BEAM SWITCHING. from X2 to X1 during a single pulse has been achieved for the first time.

Early measurements indicated 2.1 x 10<sup>11</sup> protons in X1 and 1.2 x 10<sup>11</sup> in X2, from a circulating beam of about 10<sup>12</sup>. It is hoped to improve the technique, particularly since the present extraction magnet is not laminated.
