ONCE A RAILWAY MAN!

On Thursday, 30 August about one hundred and thirty friends and colleagues assembled in the Lecture Theatre to say farewell to Tom Gresham on his retirement.

It was back in 1924 that Tom's working life began when he joined the LMS railway as an apprentice at the Derby works. He was a railways man for thirty years rising to a Deputy Plant Engineer before joining Harwell in October 1954 as an Engineer Grade 3. So at the age of 46 Tom started a new career at first on remote handling, then on to the neutron booster and finally, as a Harwell man, the design of the 15 MeV Injector tank for NIMROD -come to think of it, it does resemble a locomotive boiler!

He became a member of the Rutherford Laboratory staff on I January 1961 although he had previously worked here for some years. Since those early days Tom has been associated with many projects but above all - magnets and latterly, concrete magnets. He has always earned the respect of his engineering peers but more than that, he will be remembered as the engineer to whom physicists could talk.

Tom has retired to a house on the coast in Mid Wales. One gathers that a railway, run by enthusiasts is near by - after all, it is said that once a railway man......! Mr Bowles the Chief Engineer presented Tom with a parting gift contributed by his many friends and colleagues.

We should like to add our best wishes - it will one feels not be an idle retirement.
