RUTHERFORD LABORATORY LECTURE

Dr P F Chester, the Director of the Central Electricity Research Laboratories at Leatherhead is the speaker in the next lecture in the Rutherford Laboratory Series. Helicoflex - A New Concept in Metal 'O' Ring Seals - by members of Dowty Seals Ltd.

The Helicoflex seal is a metal 'O' ring seal with an elastic core giving good recovery and resilience, and is used extensively by CEA France in nuclear installations and ultra-high vacuum applications. It is capable of use under conditions as follows:- temperature range of -270°C to +700°C, pressure of 10,000 psi max to a vacuum level of 10⁻¹⁰ torr (limit of test). Size - from 4 - 6000 mm, a choice of linings and shapes other than circular. Machined grooves need not be used and surface finish can be up to 250 micro inches.
