## **Nimrod Postscript**

Quiet consummation have; and renowned be thy grave!

To complete the trilogy of events to signify the close down of Nimrod and indeed the close down of an era for the Rutherford Laboratory many distinguished guests were invited to the Laboratory on the 27 June 1978 to a Nimrod Commemoration event. The commemoration took the form of a series of addresseson various aspects of Nimrod's life and conduct.

Sir Harrie Massey in his introductory remarks spoke about the early days of accelerator development and the early accelerator meetings chaired by Sir John Cockcroft, which were the fore-runners of the meetings which eventually selected the accelerator to be named Nimrod. The first address was given by Sir Denys Wilkinson with


The first address was given by Sir Denys Wilkinson with the title "the State of Particle Physics Prior to the Construction of Nimrod". Sir Denys, however, when he began said that he wished to talk less about the particle physics but more about other things prior to the construction of Nimrod. He then went on to speak about the many fascinating exchanges and discussions that occurred prior to the conception and eventual birth of NIRNS, the Rutherford Laboratory and Nimrod.

Dr Leo Hobbis spoke next on the construction and commissioning of Nimrod. Dr Hobbis presented some extremely interesting insights into the way the eventual decision was made to select the final design parameters for Nimrod. He gave the audience a unique opportunity of hearing excerpts from tapes made of the early meetings. The voices of Sir John Cockcroft, Dr Pickavance, Dr John Adams

and several other eminent men were clearly heard debating the various arguments about accelerator types and designs. At the conclusion of his talk Dr Hobbis unveiled a memento of the closure of Nimrod which he presented to Dr Pickavance. The memento turned out to be the master key which controlled the Nimrod beam. Dr Hobbis expressed the wish that Dr Pickavance would take the key together with the elegant tag attached (aquired legitimately from the Hotel Moderne in Geneva) and keep it safe until it is needed when the spallation neutron source is commissioned A talk on the Physics carried out on Nimrod was given by Dr Dalitz. He emphasised the significant impact of the work on fundamental physics during Nimrod's 15 years of existence and that the work would not stop but would be carried on elsewhere. Dr Dalitz also touched on some of the difficulties of pursuing the very complex scientific problems that were faced by high energy physicists. is little doubt that the physics done on Nimrod which in the main took very poorly characterised phenomena and accurately filled in a huge amount of detail was done very thoroughly and supremely well.

Dr Stafford in concluding the afternoon's presentations spoke about the many projects currently in the Laboratory's programme and observed that although the year was one in which Nimrod was closed down it was also the 21st anniversary of the formation of NIRNS.
