Club House

In early May the R15 Club House was removed to make way for a new office block with the promise that within a few months it would rise again on its new site.

Problems have arisen since, with the re-siting and additions to the hut, to provide much needed extra facilities, and as yet no firm date is available for the completion of the project.

All this has had a serious effect on the various clubs who use the hut. The Table Tennis Club has been the hardest hit. Over the years they have built up a strong Club with teams in the Didcot and District League.

The Model Railway and Radio Clubs are inoperative at the moment.

Sports Field

We are fortunate to have our own Sports Field located outside the site fence near the R22 Restaurant. The facilities include:
